- 1. The name of the school is Bridge School Malvern
- 2. The school is an independent school and a CIO
- 3. This Instrument is subject to the Constitution of the CIO
- 4. The name of the governing body is 'The Governing Body of Bridge School Malvern'
- 5. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. All the trustees of the CIO
 - b. Other governors appointed by the governing body who are not trustees of the CIO
 - c. 1 headteacher
- 6. The maximum number of governors is 13 and the minimum is 4
- 7. A quorum is two thirds of governors
- 8. The CEO and the Clerk shall attend all meetings of the Governing Body
- 9. We actively seek to appoint governors with skills and experience in the following settings: education, school governance, business, finance, safeguarding, law, special educational needs, human resources.
- 10. There is an expectation that governors will be in sympathy with the Statement of Belief on page 2, and that there shall always be a majority of governors who have a proactive Christian faith
- 11. The term of office for all governors shall be between 1 year and 4 years as determined by the appointing body at the time of appointment and notified to the clerk. This will need to dovetail with the terms of office of the trustees, as specified in the CIO constitution
- 12. The Governing Body may establish such sub-committees as it deems necessary to carry out its duties. Every such sub-committee must include at least two governors who are also a trustee of the CIO
- 13. This instrument of government comes into effect on 23rd March 2022
- 14. This instrument was made by order of the Governing Body on 23rd March 2022

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed and approved by the full Governing Body every five years.



Statement of Belief

The founders of Bridge School Malvern set the school up as a response to their Christian faith and values. These Christian values are important to us.
